

Guidance for Researchers - Researchfish

It is important for Pancreatic Cancer UK to demonstrate how funding for research is being used and show the difference we are making with our investments to our supporters, donors and within the research community. It is also crucial that as an organisation we are able to show how we perform against our organisational aims and objectives.

Since 2013 we have been using Researchfish to monitor and measure impact from our investments.

What is Researchfish?

[Researchfish is a web portal](#) enabling grant holders to record all their outputs and outcomes in one place. Researchfish is used by Medical bodies, Charities and Universities.

How to access Researchfish?

All Pancreatic Cancer UK grant holders will be requested to join Researchfish. This will be their personal account which they will be able to use for any funding organisation that use Researchfish. Grant holders can then attribute relevant outcomes against their awards and share their outcomes with us.

When to submit information?

Submission deadlines are in January each year, an email will be sent to all grant holders prior to the next submission date.

Annual and final report

All grant holders will still need to submit final and annual report to Pancreatic Cancer UK as agreed in the contractual agreement.

How will Pancreatic Cancer UK use this information?

We will use the analysis from Researchfish to understand where further investment needs to be made and to inform future research work in pancreatic cancer. Information collected will be presented to our supporters, donors and key stakeholders within the research community.
