The role

- Increase the amount of donations received from your region
- Spread the word about our research, campaigning and support services for anyone that needs us
- Engage with health professionals, community groups and organisations to support Pancreatic Cancer UK's work

We are looking for a volunteer who:

- Is passionate about wanting to make a difference for everyone affected by pancreatic cancer
- Is self-motivated, confident and has good organisational and time management skills
- Has excellent communication skills
- Is professional, friendly and positive
- Is able to travel around their local area

Examples of general tasks that the role could include but is not limited to:

- Building relationships with local community groups to ask if they will support the charity
- Sharing your personal experience of pancreatic cancer in talks or speeches, if you have been personally affected, to demonstrate the impact of the disease
- Speaking at a range of events and venues that could include: healthcare professionals study days, Rotary club meetings, golf club events, parliamentary events, community groups, or religious organisations.
- Raising awareness of pancreatic cancer through local talks or distribution of awareness raising materials
- Supporting Pancreatic Cancer UK supporters at their fundraising events
- Holding fundraising collections
- Collecting cheques or collection tins from supporters
- Speaking to local media, with support of the Pancreatic Cancer UK team
