What impact will volunteering in this role have:

You'll be congratulating our runners on behalf of Pancreatic Cancer UK after they've come across the finish line! You'll be sharing in their remarkable achievement and helping them get to the post race reception to celebrate.

What will I be doing?

- Standing at one of our designated points in the Meet and Greet section after the finish line and looking for our runners in a Pancreatic Cancer UK running vest
- When you spot a runner, you'll approach them and ask if they want to be walked over the post-race reception
- Walk with the runner the 15 minutes to our post-race reception and then walk back
- Repeat!

Do I need any skills or attributes to do this role?

- *You need to be alert, proactive and confident in approaching people you don't know*
- *A good sense of direction*
- *Good verbal communication – runners can be tired and emotional*
- *Enjoy meeting new people and working as part of a team*

Accessibility:

- This role involves standing and walking for a few hours and no seating is available
- This event will be loud and crowded, if you have sensitivity to loud noises or crowds, we'd recommend skipping this one
