They are a research active team and continually look at quality and service improvement and education of staff and undergraduate students of all healthcare disciplines. The team sees a split of patients with and without cancer in a 50/50 split but see patients on need not diagnosis or prognosis – patients who are treatable but not curable -but we want to see people sooner than later when we can have the most impact.
